My Dear Sponsors and Donors:

Summer greetings... from India... heat, humidity, mosquitos, long power outages, holidays, crowded trains and planes, but also mangoes, lichees, guavas, papayas and did I mention mangoes? - 12 of the sweetest varieties you have ever tasted - and worth all the hardships mentioned earlier!!



In this issue, I would like to share with you the process involved in opening a new Dream Center. As you know, Odisha (Orissa) is part of the Eastern India backward block marked by high illiteracy and many tribals, deep witchcraft and superstitions, spiritual darkness and poverty. Just the right circumstances for us to plant lighthouses of hope and healing... a Good News India Dream Center. The Lord has enabled us, through the faithful giving of many of you, to open 20 of these centers in various counties (called districts in India) in the state of Odisha. Our other 6 homes are located in West Bengal.

How does a new **Dream Center begin?**

First, we pray in the right couple. I always method is always a man or woman. couple last summer for the district of Nayak. Equipped and dedicated to His selflessly for Children's Ministry. They our background checks and investigations their match with GNI. It seemed a good

begin with the right man or woman. God's never an institution. I found the right Chandragiri... Milan and Madhumita work, they came to give themselves filled out detailed paperwork, we did and conducted two interviews to ascertain match.

Next, they were sent out to the Chandragiri district, a town of about a quarter million people to scout out a suitable location. The rental house has to be close to schools, market and medical facilities. The building must be be large enough to house 30 children plus 5 adult staff. They found such a building. How a Dream Center begins... (continued)

The THIRD step is going on a SEARCH & RESCUE MISSION.... the core of what GNI does.

Finding orphans and destitute children, verifying background information and talking to their guardians about bringing them into our Dream Center. Soon word spreads all around that a Christian institution is accepting orphan children and people seem to come from everywhere bringing children they want to leave with us. While all of them seem needy, we screen and select 30 that prove to be the needlest. The process of taking kids into our Dream Center begins: applications, documents, birth and school certificates, medical information, death certificates, verification of "facts" from their village neighbors and village leadership, pastoral recommendations.



Fourth, once the kids are ready, we get staff (directors, teachers and cooks) in place, secure rental agreements, ensure water, electricity, living and study dining, spaces, toilets/bathing, etc. We also talk to the nearby principals about school admissions and get a local doctor to conduct a basic examination of each child.

Fifth, we have to inform the local government and Child Welfare Departments of our presence and the details of the children coming to live with us. Our head office personnel work with the Director to outline a one-time and ongoing budget to take care of the kids.

It costs about \$35 to bring a child in since we provide one set of casual clothes, uniforms and footwear; a 36 inch tin box in which to store their things, eating utensils and all the school supplies that they will need (backpack, books, notebooks, pencils, etc.).



















Obviously, all this brings about a ton of anxiety and excitement in the minds of the children. Anxiety because they are leaving their painful, but familiar environment; excitement because they know they will get food, "new things" and new friends. The first few weeks are quite chaotic as the kids adjust to one another, cry for their guardians, eat like crazy and run to the toilets because their system cannot handle three big meals a day when they barely got one meal a day at home. But very quickly, the Christian context of love and worship settles their spirits and they begin to revel in rediscovering childhood - to be loved, eat, play, study and worship. After that, there is no turning back. These "acres of diamonds" begin to dazzle... these broken blossoms begin to bloom... cords that were broken vibrate once more... Hallelujah.

One such diamond is Abeni Raita, a 9 year old from a village 26 km away. Both parents died from brain malaria. An Uncle & Aunt used her as a slave and beat her if she did not work hard enough. She ran away and we found out about her. She is healing, talking and trusting more each day. Transformation!
